2025 Special Census


The Village of Hampshire and the U.S. Census Bureau will be conducting a Special Census this spring to accurately count the Village's population. In the 2020 Census it was reported that the Village had a population of 7,667 residents. Since 2020, the Village has had over 600 new residential units constructed, which projects another 1,987 people residing in the Village that were not counted during the 2020 Census. An accurate count of the Village's population is key to receiving the right amount of revenue from the State of Illinois. The Village estimates that subsequent to the Special Census, the Village will receive approximately an additional \$1.5 million before the certification of the 2030 Census.

The U.S. Census will be mailing out letters and postcards to each individual residence with a unique ID code that will allow you to answer the census questions online. The U.S. Census will also be hiring local residents to gather information from the residences that do not respond online. These individuals will be vetted by the U.S. Census Bureau and will be carrying badges identifying them as U.S. Census Bureau employees. If you are interested in working for the U.S. Census Bureau for the Special Census look for additional information on the Village's social media and website for job links to apply. Training will be provided for those hired by the U.S. Census Bureau.

Residents can expect to start receiving postcards and letters with their unique ID code in late March and through early April. When you receive the postcards and letters you will be able to respond to the census questions on line. In-person data collection will occur from May through June for those that do not respond online.

All responses to the Special Census are anonymous,

private, and protected by law. Residents' responses cannot be used against them in any way. No individual or entity, including the Census Bureau, can track down your response. Even if you are not a U.S. Citizen you should still respond as you count towards the population of the Village.

Special Census

Dear Residents,

This spring the Village will be conducting a Special Census completed by the U.S. Census Bureau. This Special Census is critical in receiving funding from the State of Illinois that will fund key projects in the Village, including street maintenance, water/sewer infrastructure projects, and other projects that may possibly not be able to be completed without this additional funding.

The Village is set to receive approximately an additional \$1.5 million before the certification of the 2030 census. We are a growing community, and we need to make sure that each of our residents is counted in the census! So, when you receive those letters and postcards from the U.S. Census Bureau, make sure to respond online to give the Census Bureau an accurate count of the Village of Hampshire's population! If you are unable to respond online, Census Bureau employees will visit your residence to gather the information. They will be wearing badges so you know who they are and that they can be trusted.

If you are interested in working for the U.S. Census Bureau to collect information, watch for postings on the Village's social media and Village website for more information yet to come. Nothing is better than a friendly face you know from your own community to gather the information.

To familiarize you with what to look for, we have published examples of the postcards and letters you will receive in the mail on page one. So, make sure you don't accidentally throw them away with your junk mail.

FIRE SAFETY TIPS

Spring is here and it's time to clean house. Here are some fire safety tips to be aware of as you start your Spring-Cleaning endeavors.

<u>Clear out any clutter from your home, especially in hallways and stairways.</u>
Did you know that clutter provides fuel for a fire to spread? Make sure that all of your exits are clear and that there is a clear path to them.

Check your smoke alarms & carbon monoxide detectors.

Test your smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors to ensure they are working properly. Replace the batteries and look for any corrosion on the batteries or their connection points. It is advised that these detectors be replaced every ten years.

Don't use electrical appliances or tools with frayed cords.

Using damaged appliance cords could start a fire. This is also an excellent time to check your extension cords too. Too many devices plugged in can overload the outlet and cause a fire.

Check for water around electrical appliances.

Check for water around electrical appliances, such as your washing machine, dryer, or dishwasher. If you notice any water, have a professional inspect your appliance to make sure it is safe to use.

Check all your appliances to make sure they are in good working condition.

This includes your stove, oven, microwave, toaster, coffee maker, and anything else you use daily. If you notice any issues with an appliance, have it repaired or replaced as soon as possible.

It's a great time to clean your clothes dryer vent & lint trap.
Lint is highly combustible and can easily cause a fire if it isn't removed.
Clean your dryer vent and hoses at least once a year to remove and prevent any excess lint buildup or blockages.

Do I Need a Building Permit?

A Building Permit is required for most projects per the Village's Municipal Code. Examples of projects that require a building permit are fences, decks, window/door replacements, patios, sidewalks, roofs, solar panels, pools, sheds, water heater/HVAC replacements.

The Village uses a third-party firm, <u>SAFEbuilt</u>, for its building permitting and inspection services. All building permits can be submitted online through the <u>CommunityCore</u> portal. <u>CommunityCore</u> is a one-stop shop for the entire permitting process, from applying for the building permit to receiving your building permit and inspection card.



THINK BEFORE YOU DIG!


Call JULIE at 811

As Spring comes around and you are getting ready for some construction projects remember to **Think Before You Dig!** And **Call JULIE at 811**. **JULIE** is a free service that will coordinate with utility companies to mark by either a flag or paint the location of their underground utilities on your property and the nearby area. This is very important so that if you are digging, you or your contractor do not inadvertently damage any underground utilities that could cost money and disruption of services.

Many think that utility lines are buried deep below the ground, however, that is not necessarily true. Some utility lines are buried just below the surface that can be damaged by just a shovel. Whether you are installing posts for a new fence or a slab for a shed, make sure you know where the underground utilities are on your property to save yourself time and money.

What do the different flag colors mean? Each color represents a different type of utility line, whether electric, sewer, water, etc. See the image below
