Public Works Facility Groundbreaking

The Village of Hampshire elected officials and staff, along with project contractor Lamp, Inc., held a groundbreaking ceremony for the Village's new Public Works Facility to be located at 185 Town Place Road on April 4th.

The new Public Works Facility is a result of careful planning and consideration for the current and future needs of the Village as it continues to grow with both new residential and commercial areas. Currently, the Streets Department is located at two facilities on Klick Street and Allen Road.

The new Public Works Facility, designed by Kluber Architects, meets the needs of the Village for the next couple of decades, with opportunity to expand the facility if and when needed. The new 33,000-square-foot facility will house the Village's Street Department staff and equipment. Providing indoor parking for the village vehicles and equipment, that are worth more than a million dollars, will increase their service lifespan by shielding them from rain, snow and other elements that cause corrosion. Construction will begin in early May 2025 with a construction end date of January 2026.

The new Public Works Facility consists of a garage, fleet maintenance bays, shops, employee areas, and administrative offices for the Streets Department staff. The Village is excited for the construction and completion of the new Public Works Facility as it continues to provide the best service possible to the residents of Hampshire.

The Theme Of Renewal

Dear Residents.

As we enter the Spring and Summer months of May and June, I think about the theme of renewal. Renewal cycles that our lawns, trees, and vegetation go through after every winter, and the renewal of community pride as we get together as neighbors and friends for the various spring and summer events held throughout the community.

As Village President, I want to renew my commitment, and that of the Village Board, to leading effectively, efficiently, and transparently for the Hampshire residents and business community. With your trust, each of the Village Board members sits at the dais to make decisions that will impact both the residents and businesses of today and tomorrow. These decisions include approving the construction of a new Public Works Garage, implementing a 1% non-home rule sales tax, and seeking alternative revenue sources, such as applying for state and federal grants.

The construction of a new 33,000-square-foot Public Works Garage will provide indoor parking for critical Village assets worth over \$1 million. A 1% non-home rule sales tax was implemented, primarily paid by non-residents shopping and dining at businesses along the US Route 20 and I-90 corridors, to raise additional revenue for critical projects. The Village Board and Village staff work to ensure that the Village applies for grants and other funding sources to lessen the burden on residents. An example of a grant awarded to the Village is the Safe Routes to School Grant, which provides funding to install sidewalks for our students to utilize as they walk to and from school.

For those wanting to learn more about the decisions being made by your Village Board, I encourage you to attend Village Board meetings on the 1st and 3rd Thursday of every month at 7 PM at Village Hall, 234 S. State Street. Downloading the MyHampshire App also lets you stay connected with the Village and report concerns and issues such as property maintenance violations, downed trees or utility lines, or just general inquiries.

I would be remiss if I didn't thank you all for your support during my first term, and thank you for electing me to a second term. This is the most incredible job in the world, and it is a lot of fun working alongside each of you to make our community a better place.

With the election certified, I can congratulate Trustees Heather Fodor and Laura Pollastrini on their reelection to our board and welcome Trustee Erin E.D. Jarnero to our board. I should also thank trustee Lionel Mott, who is stepping away from the board after 4 years of steadfast and dedicated leadership. Thank you, Trustee Mott, for always being that calm, impactful voice, especially in challenging conversations.

WHAT HAMPSHIRE TOWNSHIP DOES

VILLAGE UTILITY BILLS

The Village is on a bi-monthly cycle and issues utility bills during the first week of the month in odd-numbered months. Utility bills are due the first Friday of the even-numbered months.

If payment is not received by 4:30pm on the due date, a late penalty of 10% is added to the account. The Village will mail a late notice bill reflecting the additional charge and include a due date for payment of all outstanding charges. Approximately 7 days after the issuance of the late notice bill, the Village hangs delinquency notices (door hangers) that are hand-delivered to the service addresses of any unpaid accounts.

If the customer has not made payment by the due date included on the delinquency notice, the Village will assess a \$50.00 fee and schedule the water service for shut off. To restore service, the customer must pay the outstanding charges or make a payment arrangement with the Village. Please note that restoration of disconnected services happens only between 7:30am and 3:30pm Mondays through Fridays.

Payments can be made at Village Hall or online through the Village's website. We encourage you to enroll in the Village's automatic payment program to assure your payment arrives on time.

FIRE HYDRANT FLUSHING PROGRAM

The Village's Public Works crews will be in your neighborhood this Spring to flush the hydrants on your streets. Hydrant flushing involves flowing fire hydrants to create high water flows that will scour out fine sediments from the water mains. This work is being done as a part of the Village's ongoing efforts to deliver the safest and highest quality water to you.

What do you need to do?

- 1. Expect temporarily discolored water
- 2. Avoid washing clothes
- Clean faucet screens if you experience low pressure or low volume

- 1. Old Mill Manor Subdivision, Hillcrest Ave, Highland Ave, and Panama St. April 28-30
- White Oak Ponds and Highlands Subdivisions. April 30, May
 1-2
- 3. Tuscany Woods Subdivision. May 5-7
- 4. Historic Part of Town East of State St. May 7-9
- Historic Part of Town West of State St. May 12-14
- 6. Parkside and Stonegate Subdivisions. May 14-16
- 7. Hampshire Prairie and Meadows, May 19-21
- 8. Lakewood Subdivision, week of May 26-30

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Why is Hydrant Flushing Necessary?

Hydrant flushing enhances water quality by flushing sediments from the water mains, verifies the proper operation of hydrants and valves, and maintains firefighting capabilities.

2. What should I do when Public Works crews are flushing hydrants in my area? When hydrants are being flushed in your area avoid running tap water, using the washing machine, and running the dishwasher until the flushing is done.

3. What should I do after hydrant flushing is complete?

If tap water is used during flushing, it could come out full of sediment that cause discoloration. Shut the water off and wait several minutes. After waiting, check the clarity by running cold water for a few minutes, allowing new water to work its way into your pipes. If the water is clear, it is OK to use. If not, wait a few more minutes and check again. In some cases, there may be slight discoloration for a few hours. This discoloration only affects the appearance of the water; it does not affect water quality. There are no health hazards associated with discolored water. Avoid washing laundry during scheduled flushing times. Wait until the water runs clear at the tap, then wash a load of dark cloths first. If pressure or volume seems low, check your faucet screens for trapped particles.

BUILDING SAFETY MONTH

Building Safety Month, held each May, raises awareness about the importance of updated building codes in creating safe, sustainable structures. Led by the International Code Council, this campaign unites industry professionals and agencies to promote strong building practices that protect communities from hazards.

Safe, well-built homes and public spaces ensure durability and resilience, reducing risks from fire, severe weather, and structural wear. Sustainability also plays a key role, with energy-efficient buildings lowering costs and environmental impact through eco-friendly materials and

waste reduction.

You can help by learning local building codes, supporting policy updates, and making home safety improvements. This year's theme, "GAME ON!" encourages everyone to get involved in building a safer, more sustainable future.
